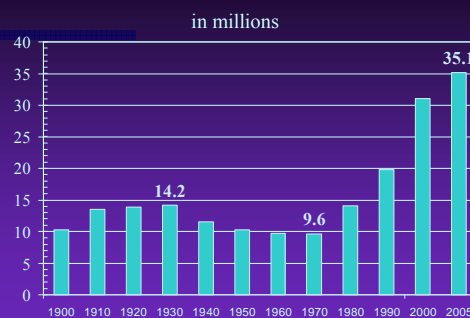

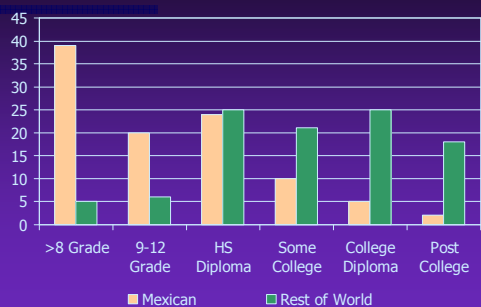

Education: Immigrants vs Natives



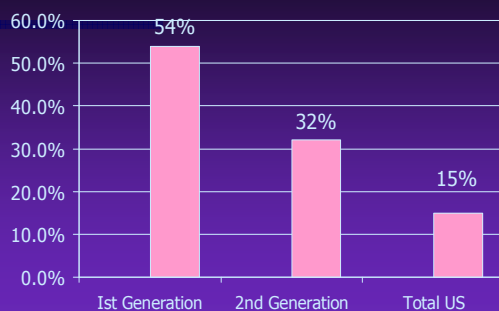

Immigrant Education: Mexican vs. Other Origins



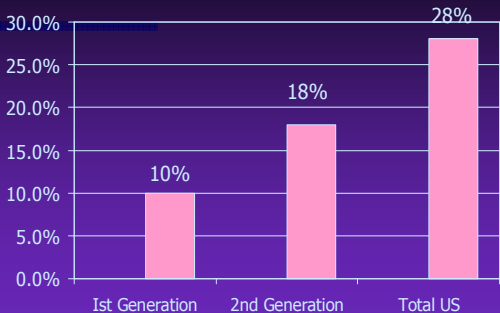

Hispanics: Less than High School



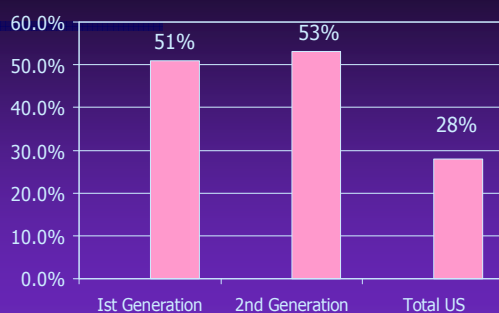

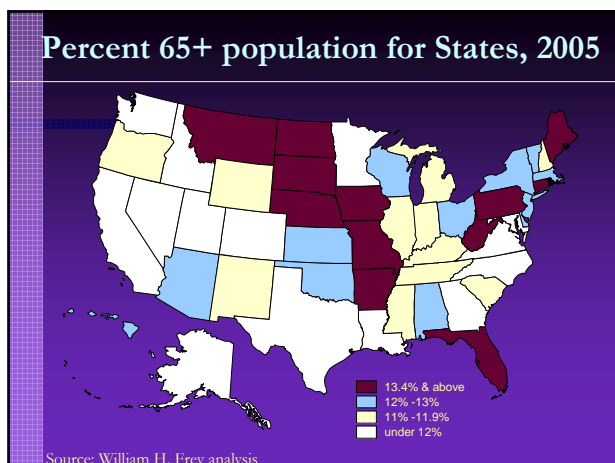
